THE AUTHOR

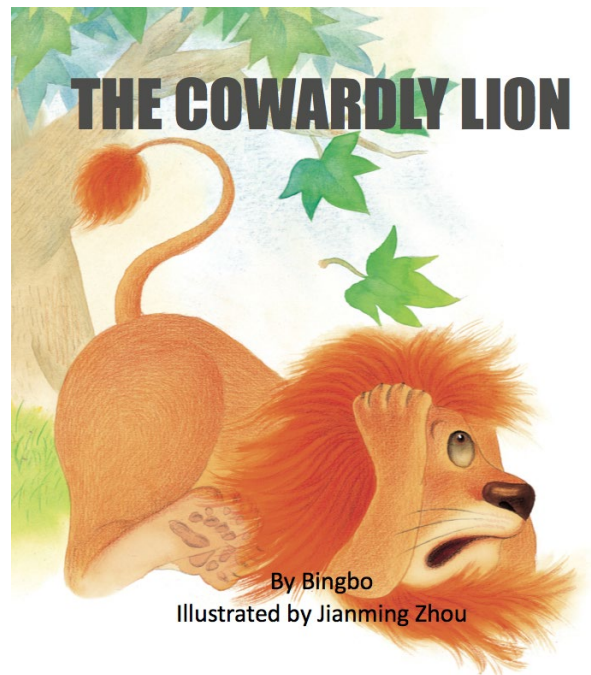
