### THE AUTHOR

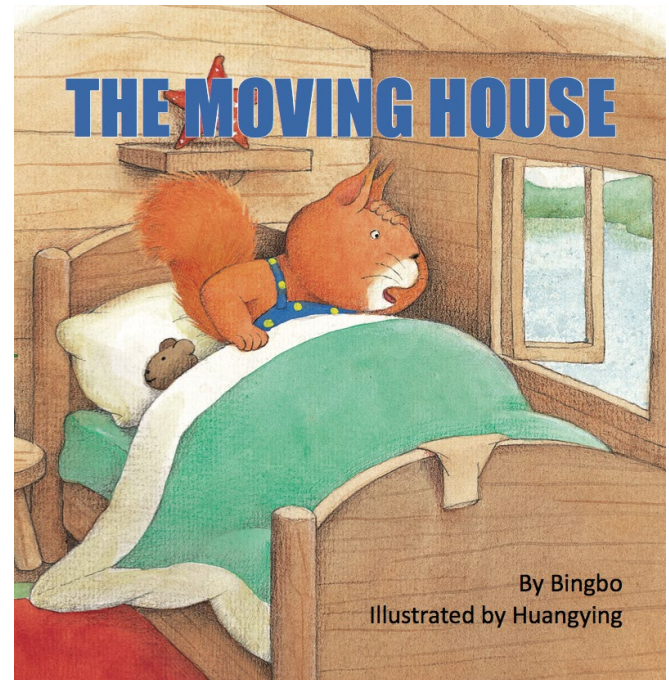
